

## Welcome to Telford Lake Trail

This 8.2-kilometre path, a recognized part of The Great Trail, takes visitors around Telford Lake, the largest environmentally significant area in Leduc.

Telford Lake is the natural environment for many land- and water-dwelling species including amphibians, waterfowl, shorebirds, songbirds, birds of prey, rodents, large mammals and pollinator insects. It also hosts many plant species, several classified as provincially rare.

Telford Lake is the start of a wildlife corridor that extends to Saunders Lake in Leduc County. This corridor provides habitat connectivity, important for animals that move around their territories to find mates, hunt and forage.



## What you will see along the trail

As you walk around the Telford Lake Trail you will see an ever-changing landscape of upland forests and meadows, aquatic wetlands and lake shore. Watch for interpretative signs that offer a chance to learn more about the species you are likely to encounter, and their natural habitats.

## Recreational Trail Etiquette & Safety

### USE AT YOUR OWN RISK

- Stay on designated trails.
- Do not approach wildlife or nesting areas or feed wild animals or birds.
- Keep dogs on leash. Scoop the poop.
- Stay to the right side of the trail.
- Put garbage in designated bins.
